Online Safety - Roblox:

In 2022, PEGI decided to change the age rating for **Roblox**. Roblox is now considered as a platform with diverse content rather than an individual game product. The use of sexualised language among primary school age children is becoming more prevalent due to this gaming platform and, as a result, the PEGI 7 age rating was replaced by the Parental Guidance label (an icon displaying an exclamation mark, always accompanied by the 'parental guidance recommended' text descriptor). Such a change is rather unusual for PEGI, but given the large variety of user-generated content that is available in Roblox, it was deemed necessary. Instagram:

We will soon be starting to use our school's Instagram page as a way to update/remind parents, carers & family members about events and activities happening in school. We know that many family members such as aunts, uncles, grandparents etc, can't access School Spider but do use Instagram and this can be a nice way for them to keep updated with what is going on at school. We will also be using the platform to promote the school to prospective parents. The account won't be monitored daily in the same way that the school email is, so we ask parents not to use this channel to communicate with us about their child/ren. As always, safeguarding is our main priority so we have developed a new social media policy which all Instagram posts will adhere to. This policy can be viewed on the school website. Parents/carers will need to complete the permission slip on School Spider to let us know whether you **DO** or **DO NOT** give permission for your child's image to be used in social media posts. In most cases we won't need to use children's names, they will be referred to by group (e.g. Y6, Nursery, Debate Team etc.) but if we do need to use names (e.g. in the case of an individual achievement) this will be first name only. You'll be able to find the permission slip in "surveys and forms". If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the school office who will be more than happy to discuss this with you.

Names:

Please could all items of uniform be labelled with children's names. We are getting a lot of lost or misplaced items and it's really hard to reunite them with the owners if there isn't a name (or if the name hasn't been changed from a second-hand piece!). Please make sure all items are named and this hasn't washed out. Thank you.

Free School Meals

If you are entitled to any of the following benefits, you may be entitled to free school meals. Please contact the office for a free school meals application form.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from NASS under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit

Children who are entitled to free school meals also receive a Pupil Premium which means the school gets extra funding to spend on your child to cover costs of trips, extra-curricular activities and additional interventions to boost their learning. It will also entitle you to support in the holidays, free holiday clubs and food boxes at times such as Christmas so it's worth applying even if your child wants to remain on sandwiches or are on free meals because they are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2.

<u>PE Kit:</u> Please remember that all children from Reception to Year 6 need to have a PE kit in school. This should consist of shorts or leggings, t-shirt and pumps. It's also useful to add in a spare pair of socks especially when girls are wearing tights with their uniform.

Flu Vaccinations

Emails have been sent out with a link for you to consent or opt out of the Flu nasal vaccination for your child from Reception to Year 6. If you did not receive this email or are unable to fill in the online consent, paper copies are available from the school office. The form needs to be completed for every child (specifying whether you would like them to have a vaccination or not) and will close on 26th October 2023.
