#### Nursery Applications for 2024 and future years:

We still have places available for Nursery in September 2024, so if you know anyone still looking for a place, please spread the word. We take children in September who will have already turned 3. We offer both 15 and 30 hours and also other flexible options. Our before and after school club also takes children who are in our Nursery.

We also take names for Nursery places for future years and there may even be spaces for these children to start in the term after they are three (January starters), so if you'd like to put your child's name down then it's never too early!

#### Second Hand Uniform:

We will relist the second hand uniform on School Spider next week. Please do make use of this – we get so much in that it can be hard to store! Please order what you need or could use and it will be sent home with your child.

#### **Holiday requests:**

Please note that holiday requests should be made on either a form available from the office or by email to the admin email address. Holidays should not be requested on School Spider – this is just for notifying us of illness.

#### Whit Friday:

We are now finalising our arrangements for the Whit Friday walk. If your child is walking with another community group, they should still come to school to get their registration mark. They will then need to be picked up by an adult and taken to the community group to walk. Once picked up they are then the responsibility of the adult picking up and not school's responsibility. After the walk, they should return to school for lunch and the afternoon registration before we close. Children walking with community groups can wear the uniform of their groups whilst in school.

As school is open, children not wanting to walk should still attend school.

School closes at 1.30pm on Whit Friday. There is no Little Stones after school.

#### Nut and Sesame free school:

We have had quite a few children bringing in items in their packed lunches that contain nuts or sesame. Please remember to check things like seeded bread and houmous (tahini is sesame seed paste). Thank you for your support in keeping all children in our school safe.
