Safe Squad Year 6:

On Tuesday 6th February, Safe Squad will be in school working with the Year 6 children to discuss how to keep themselves safe in lots of different scenarios, from being safe online to safety near water, fire safety and lots of things in-between.

Online Safety Parents and Carers session:

On Tuesday 6th February, Mrs Dawson will be running a parents and carers online safety session after school. These sessions will run at 3.30pm and will be repeated at 5pm. Due to the content of these sessions, children MUST not attend. Further information will follow next week.

Water Bottles:

Children should all bring a water bottle that is filled with plain water to school each day for them to sip from as needed. Thank you for your support.

Second hand uniform:

Stocks have been replenished and we have a huge amount of second-hand uniform – including jumpers, cardigans, trousers, skirts and shoes! So please check on school spider if you want any – even if it's the next size to grow into! Just 'purchase' it on school spider for free and we will send it home with your child at the end of the day. If you click the drop down button, you will see how many are available in each size and please order as many as you will make use of.

School shoes:

Please remember that children should be wearing black school shoes and not trainers for school.

MMR Vaccine:

As many of you may have seen, there is a national concern about the uptake of the MMR jab and the risk this presents of a serious measles outbreak. Intrahealth are currently offering a catch up programme for the vaccine but the take up at present is low across Tameside. Parents/carers can take up the offer from Intrahealth or by contacting their GP to ensure that the serious long term health risks of measles are mitigated. 1 in 5 people with measles will need to go to hospital and 9 in 10 unvaccinated children will catch measles if someone in their class has it.

We also know there are a number of adults (particularly those aged 18-35) who may be missing one or more doses and therefore will be vulnerable to infection. If unsure, you should be able to check your records via the NHS app or by speaking to your GP practice. It is never too late to get the MMR vaccination – children and adults alike can get it via their GP practice if they are missing a dose or doses.

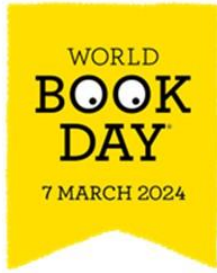

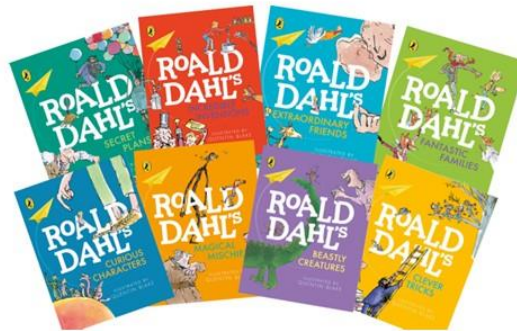
EYFS and Key Stage One (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) children can dress up as a character from a **Julia Donaldson** book.

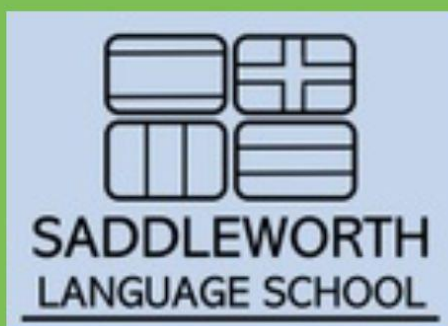
