Parking:

We have had complaints this week from local residents about parking. Unsafe and inconsiderate parking does not help us to retain good relations with our local neighbours and being part of the local community is something that we believe is important. If people park in this space, this causes an obstruction and will cause other parents to turn around in a more dangerous position. It also poses another obstacle for pedestrians. Please can I ask that all parents and carers consider our local residents and park with consideration even if it is just for a short time.

Free Qustodio monitoring on children's devices:

Qustodio allows Tameside families the access to be able to filter and block 2 devices for free for ever. So parents can monitor websites children are accessing, set screen time limits and many other things. Just scan the QR code below to set up your access. In a family with 2 adults, each one can do this for 2 devices allowing you free control on 4 devices. We strongly recommend that this is set up and used.




