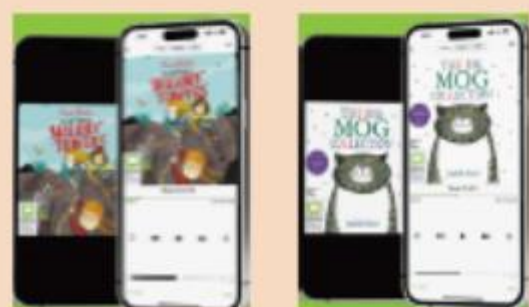

Lego Clubs

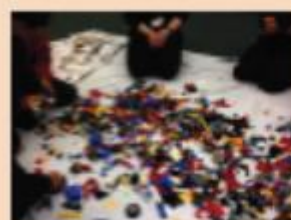
Love Lego? Did you know we host Lego Clubs in the library?
