Free Parking at the Market Ground Car Park

You can now park your car for free for two hours at the Market Ground Car Park, thanks to a change in car parking fees that we and many others in the community have been lobbying for. If you want to avoid the congestion and stress of finding a place to park on Old Brow or West Grove, we'd encourage you to park in the Market Ground and make the short walk down to school - and enjoy all the physical and mental health benefits from doing so!

Bikeability will be taking place for Year 6 on Monday 19th May and Tuesday 20th May. A link to complete online consent has been sent out via school spider last week. Please complete as soon as possible.

Robinwood Parents' meeting:

A meeting for all parents and carers of children going to Robinwood this year will be held at 5pm on Monday 19th May.

Whit Friday, 13th June:

Letters about the Whit walks will be sent out soon and you will need to complete a school spider form to tell us whether or not you want your child to walk with school. Children that don't walk will remain in school.

- Children in Nursery who wish to walk must be accompanied by an adult otherwise they will not be allowed to walk. Please notify us of whether you will walk with your child on School Spider. If children do not walk, they will remain in Nursery.
- Children in Reception upwards will walk with school supervised by school staff, unless parents request on School Spider, that they remain in school. This may mean that children are placed in different classes as appropriate.
- If children do not attend school on the morning of Whit Friday or do not return to school after the Whit walks, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

School will close at 1.30pm on this day.



16 years old +

The NPLQ is the most awarded lifeguard qualification in the UK and Ireland and is also internationally recognised. More than 40,000 pool lifeguards qualify with the RLSS UK every year, and there are currently more than 80,000 pool lifeguards qualified in the NPLQ – 95% of all UK pool lifeguards.

RLSS UK is regulated by Ofqual, Qualifications Wales and CCEA in Northern Ireland.
