Free Parking at the Market Ground Car Park *STARTS MONDAY 9TH JUNE*

From Monday 9th June, you can park your car for free for two hours at the Market Ground Car Park, once a day, thanks to a change in car parking fees that we and many others in the community have been lobbying for. **Please make sure you still get a free ticket though, otherwise you will get a parking fine!**

If you want to avoid the congestion and stress of finding a place to park on Old Brow or West Grove, we'd encourage you to park in the Market Ground and make the short walk down to school - and enjoy all the physical and mental health benefits from doing so!

School Streets:

Please remember that although the school streets barricade stops most traffic, some is still coming through due to being residents or having a disabled badge. Please bear this in mind if you are letting children walk down the hill on their own as the road is not traffic free.

Please remember that children should be wearing school uniform including black school shoes for school. All second hand uniform is available for free on school spider. Please do order what you can use.

Monday 12th May:

Year 5 will be walking up to Mossley Hollins High School to take part in the Big Sing in the afternoon of Monday 12th May. This will be from 1.45 – 2.45pm, so we will walk them there and back to school for collection from school at roughly the normal time. They may just be a few minutes late if the event overruns. Parents/carers can wait in the playground until they return to school.

Robinwood Parents' meeting:

A meeting for all parents and carers of children going to Robinwood this year will be held at 5pm on Monday 19th May.

Whit Friday, 13th June:

Letters were sent out last week asking parents/carers to complete a school spider form to tell us whether or not you want your child to walk with school. Children that don't walk will remain in school.

- Children in Nursery who wish to walk must be accompanied by an adult otherwise they will not be allowed to walk. Please notify us of whether you will walk with your child on School Spider. If children do not walk, they will remain in Nursery.
- Children in Reception upwards will walk with school supervised by school staff, unless parents request on School Spider, that they remain in school. This may mean that children are placed in different classes as appropriate.
- If children do not attend school on the morning of Whit Friday or do not return to school after the Whit walks, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

School will close at 1.30pm on this day.
