#### Year 3 Spanish day at Mossley Hollins

### Children running along Valeside:

If you come to school or go home past the houses on Valeside, please do not allow children to run up and down outside the houses. This is people's property and garden space and is not for children to run along. The route is extremely uneven and coupled with the steps at the end of the row, it can present a danger. Please ensure children stay on the road / pavement rather than right in front of the houses. Thank you for your consideration to our neighbours.

### **School Streets:**

I am sure that parents and carers will have noticed that the School Street scheme has improved safety for our children on the way to and from school. We really do need more volunteers to keep the scheme running. Can you help, even if you are only available occasionally or on one morning or one afternoon each week? There's a short training session to show you what to do, and if you need childcare Little Stones will look after your child for free for the time you are volunteering. Please let us know at school or contact the office.

#### Parent Governors:

We currently have vacancies for parent governors on our governing board. Our existing parent governors are happy to continue in their roles, but if other parents would like to put themselves forward, we will hold an election. As the school

will soon academise, we expect further opportunities for new governors in the future, so if you are interested in the role, either now or later, please let us know. To find out more, or for an informal chat with the Headteacher or the Chair of Governors get in touch with the office. If no one comes forward before the 10<sup>th</sup> October, the current parent governors will be re-elected unopposed.

### **School Dinner ordering:**

Thank you for returning menu choices for dinners, these menus will now cycle around until we introduce a new ordering and payment system after October half term. Because of this please don't pay for meals too far in advance.

#### WOW scheme:

To encourage children (and parents!) to walk to school, we are continuing with our WOW badges. Children need to walk three times a week to receive a badge each month. This is either from home or, if they live too far away, there is the option to park and stride which still counts. For this to count, children need to have walked either from the Market Ground / St Joseph's or the train station / the Gillery. Walking from the road closure sign doesn't count! Please do talk to your child about where they have walked from and whether this counts as park and stride.


